

Emergency Rental Assistance Available

The state is accepting applications for Indiana Emergency Rental Assistance and **income limits have changed.**



This program can provide up to 12 months in rental assistance to help cover past due and ongoing monthly rent and utility payments for qualifying Indiana renters. Individuals or households must meet all of the following requirements:

- At least one household member has qualified for unemployment benefits or experienced a reduction in income, incurred significant costs, or experienced a financial hardship due to COVID-19.
- At least one household member must demonstrate a risk of homelessness or housing instability. Proof can include a past due rent notice, notice to vacate, eviction notice, past due utility notice, utility disconnect notice, or information that demonstrates your household is rent-burdened (spend more than 30% of your income on rent).
- Household income must be at or below 80% of the Area Median Income (which varies by county).
- The property you are seeking assistance for must be your primary residence.
- This program is for **renters only**.

Assistance can also be provided for internet expenses but additional requirements apply.
